A **1,400**-strong workforce.

Fiscally strong with more than **\$90 million** in resources and assets.

More than **80** government and education funding sources provide support for more than **60** programs, services, and departments.

Served more than **1,300** participants from school districts and other external agencies.



Served more than **4,500** professionals through statewide training contracts.

Provided more than **15,000** units of training to Northern Rivers staff.



Facilitated adoptions of **21** foster children by their foster families, providing them with permanent homes.

Assisted nearly **200** foster families in helping more than **450** children and young adults rebuild their lives.

Successfully enrolled more than **1,500** families in new care management programs designed to provide better results for more youth at lower cost to the community.



Safely kept **4,000** children in their homes and communities through child welfare services.

Provided a stable home environment for more than **250** children and young adults living in our group homes.



Educated more than **300** students in Northern Rivers schools, leading to an impressive graduation rate of nearly **90** percent.

Served students from more than **54** school districts throughout the Capital Region and beyond.

Provided nearly **20,000** behavioral health sessions through **39** offices located directly in schools serving more than **24** school districts in 6 upstate New York counties.



Helped **143** students get a head start on their careers through vocational programs

Provided therapy and counseling in nearly **50,000** sessions to more than **6,000** children, adults, and families, helping them better cope with life's difficult challenges.

Served more than **135** children from birth through age 3 in Early Head Start, preparing them for success in school, with **40** children moving on at age 3 to other programs like Head Start or preschool.

Responded to more than **3,579** emergency intervention calls for children and adults in crisis, calming situations and saving lives.



Educated more than **110** children at the Neil Hellman Preschool, which provides early learning to children who will enter the Albany and Schenectady Counties' school systems.

Helped **50** individuals coping with early-onset psychosis work toward achieving educational, work, relationship, and life goals.
