Home-Based Crisis Intervention may be the answer.**

What is Home-Based Crisis Intervention?

Home-Based Crisis Intervention (HBCI) is an intensive 4- to 6-week in-home mental health program for families with children experiencing behavioral health crises that place themselves or others at risk. Once engaged, HBCI therapists are on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to help families manage crisis and provide support.

How does it work?

HBCI services are provided using Home-builder, an in-home crisis intervention family and community model. Each week, HBCI mental health professionals make 2 or more community visits over a 4-week period to provide family therapy and support for the youth. Families maintain already established therapists and psychiatrists, and there is no cost or insurance billing for this service.

What services are offered?

The HCBI team works with families to develop parenting skills, build stronger family relationships, resolve conflicts, find peaceful solutions, enhance safety planning, and develop individual and family goals.

Fast access to services and rapid response to crises help children and families address challenges and find success and safety.

“I had lost all hope and had exhausted every resource I could find. My daughter’s behavior had become explosive and defiant. With the support of HBCI and the amazing counselor we were paired with, my daughter has turned things around.”

Our Behavioral Health Centers, located in Albany, Schenectady, and Malta, provide NYS Office of Mental Health–licensed outpatient mental health treatment services to children, adults, and families who need help managing emotional and behavioral challenges.

Mobile Crisis Services

Our Mobile Crisis Services teams provide rapid-response, community-based mental health crisis services to children and adults in need in Albany (child and adolescent services only), Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady, Warren, and Washington counties. Teams are comprised of licensed clinical supervisors and clinicians, family advocates, peer support specialists, and case managers.
